Investment policy

The investment objective of the fund is to achieve an appropriate return in Swiss francs. The investment decisions are rule-based by using a momentum-/ mean-reverting approach. The fund invests in a broadly diversified portfolio of passive index instruments such as exchange traded funds (ETFs), indexoriented investment funds, structured products, and derivatives. The fund is invested worldwide in equities, bonds, currencies and alternative investments. The overall foreign currency exposure is predominantly hedged back in Swiss francs.

Net performance in CHF (rebased to 100) and yearly performance 1)




