Investment Objective & Strategy

The Butler Credit Opportunities fund is a long/short fund investing in the European high yield market and aims to deliver the best possible performance while keeping portfolio volatility below 5% throughout the credit cycle.

The management team uses a 3-step investment approach, placing risk management and loss minimization at the heart of the portfolio management, combined with a constant search for opportunities to generate high risk-adjusted returns.

Monthly Commentary

In contrast to March, where the €HY market was largely driven by idiosyncratic (negative) news, April was mostly driven by macroeconomic information and expectations. In the US and, to a lesser extent in Europe, inflation and growth continued to prove more resilient than expected, to the extent that some market participants began to think that the Fed's next move might be a hike (while as at end '23, c150bps of cuts were expected for '24). Hence rate curves continued to move upwards. Despite Credit spreads contracting close to their mid-March lows, rate headwinds absorbed most of the monthly carry (€HY indices were wrapped around 0 monthly return in April) and, for the 3rd consecutive month, total yields widened, reaching 6.8% at the wide €HY level.

The BCO Fund lost 0.17% in April, making for the 1st month with negative alpha YTD (only c-15bps pre fees). This was mostly driven by the counter-performance of our shorts (e.g. Grifols and Intrum), which rebounded a bit, while some Cyclical longs (KemOne and Pfeleiderer) moved lower, with disappointing recent earnings questioning their capital structure – these positions have a modest sizing, which limited their negative alpha generation. Having ended March with c83% beta, we navigated close to

this level throughout April. With new issues becoming very active again by the end of the month, we took advantage of some attractive Relative Value opportunities, while boosting the Hedging compartment to remain in the same overall beta ballpark.

May began with a sharp reversal of the aforementioned rate pessimism. The May, 1 Fed FOMC meeting proved less hawkish than expected, with Chairman Powell mostly ruling out further rate hikes due to lag effects of 22/23 moves. Amazingly this idea that past hikes should exert a material slow-down impact on growth and inflation received a spectacular confirmation in the reports released on May, 3 – an overall weakish labor report and a confusing, albeit soft, ISM Non-Manufacturing report. This ignited a sharp rebound in Govies but also in general risk appetite, with market participants being more sensitive to newfound rate visibility than to the risk that the current slowdown eventually moves into a recession. May has indeed started on a strong footing in HY markets, with BCO returning to positive alpha generation; we might re-increase beta in the short run.




