Objective

The Fund aims to provide long term growth by investing in bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable interest rate) issued by companies, governments or other bodies anywhere in the world.

The Fund aims to outperform the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Corporate Bond Index (Hedged to USD) benchmark (before charges).

Portfolio securities

- The Fund invests at least 80% of its assets in investment grade bonds issued by corporations. The Fund may also invest in government bonds, sub-investment grade debt and other interest bearing securities issued anywhere in the world.
- Non-US Dollar denominated issues will typically be hedged back to US Dollars.
- The Fund may also invest in other transferable securities, money-market instruments, deposits, cash and near cash, derivatives (including currency forwards, interest rate and credit default swaps) and collective investment schemes.


