




The objective of the fund is to outperform the Refinitiv Global Focus Convertible Bond Index over a full market cycle by investing in a high-conviction portfolio of fundamentally undervalued convertible securities worldwide. Over the cycle, the fund aims to deliver an alpha of 1.5%–2.5% annually while preserving a balanced risk profile comparable to that of the benchmark or an average balanced multi-asset-class portfolio. The fund is built on an entirely bottom-up driven investment process and a disciplined focus on intrinsic value, which are crucial to delivering sustainable long-term returns. Currency risks are fully hedged into the respective share class currency.





In % of total economic exposure





Performance review

After outperforming in February, the fund experienced a slight decline in its trajectory in March. However, its total return since the beginning of the year is still solidly above the benchmark. While markets are normalizing after several shocks (the pandemic, supply chain disruptions, rising inflation and wars) and interventions by governments and central banks, higher interest rates and increased volatility do not seem to be leveling off. The fund's high-conviction approach and focus on the fundamental value of an investment helped to maintain a steady course despite the markets' volatility. The largest absolute contributors for the month were positions in the convertible bonds (CBs) of Bharti Airtel (20 bps), Wayfair (18 bps) and Shockwave Medical (16 bps) that gained 9%, 10% and 14%, respectively. Bharti continues to post solid financial performance that is underscored by a strong market position and its ability to capitalize on the growing demand for telecommunication services in India. Wayfair—a fully online furniture business that has run for more than 20 years—surprised with a shift in strategy to open a physical flagship store in Illinois. Shockwave Medical rallied on a report of acquisition talks with Johnson & Johnson. The worst absolute contributors were Li Auto (-60 bps), Zscaler (-16 bps) and Nio (-11 bps), where the respective CBs fell by 27%, 17% and 14%. Li Auto and Nio are Chinese EV manufacturers, both feeling the effects of slowing EV demand that has been affecting the sector for some time now. Furthermore, Li Auto's earnings results led to extreme volatility and initially a strong rally at the end of February, followed by a reversal in March. ZScaler posted solid quarterly results but its growth and guidance were slightly disappointing. Three investments were sold during the month without adding any new positions. As of month end, the fund had an ESG rating of A, an underweight in ESG laggards (B and CCC ratings), and roughly a third of the emissions intensity of the benchmark index. With a

Market Review

March was a constructive month for risky assets, providing a much-needed performance boost to what was an overall mixed first quarter. Global convertible bonds (CBs), as measured by Refinitiv, advanced between 1.8% and 2.6% depending on the subindex. Global equities (USD-hedged) appreciated by 3.45% during the month and by 10.2% for all of Q1, likewise recording a new all-time high. Bond yields were quietly on the move again as the yield on 10-year treasuries saw a second consecutive monthly close above 4.2% and briefly hit a 4-month high mid-March. The implied number of US Federal Reserve hikes/cuts through the end of January 2025 (as priced by the bond futures markets) declined from 7 rate cuts at the end of 2023 to just 3.5 cuts at the end of the first quarter. Investment-grade credit spreads tightened by 1 basis point (bp) in March and 6 bps in Q1, helping to offset the unfavorable move in rates and allowing the flagship Bloomberg GlobalAgg Index to eke out a small 0.01% gain YTD. High-yield spreads saw a similarly modest tightening, but the better carry allowed high-yield bonds to deliver a much more respectable 1.93% return for the quarter. The US dollar strengthened against the basket of currencies comprising the US Dollar Index (DXY) in March as well as all of Q1. Despite the strong dollar headwinds gold surged by 9%-its best monthly performance since July 2020-while crude oil gained 7.4%.
