### Investment strategy

The fund invests a minimum of two-thirds of its net assets in fixed-income and floating rate debt securities issued by private borrowers and public authorities domiciled in Sweden. The sub-fund invests in bonds denominated in SEK. The fund invests in government bonds or bonds issued by local authorities or agencies, mortgage bonds, corporate bonds with a good rating, and bonds issued by supranational institutions. The fund may further use derivative instruments to reduce risks. The fund aims to exploit market movements as well as the yield spreads between various credit risk segments. Actively managed. Benchmark used for performance comparison only. Risk characteristics of the fund's portfolio may bear some resemblance to those of the benchmark.








## Currency exposure (post-hedge) (in %)











### 3 years rolling performances





### **ESG** integration summary


A NAM level overlay of norms-based screening and exclusion list is deployed as Baseline safeguards through NAM's Responsible Investment Policy which bans investments in companies active in the production of illegal or nuclear weapons and companies with exposure to coal mining exceeding a predefined threshold. The fund adheres to NAM's Paris-Aligned Fossil Fuel Policy. NAM's Paris-Aligned Fossil Fuel Policy sets thresholds for companies' exposure to fossil fuel production, distribution and services and excludes companies that are involved beyond these thresholds if they do not have a documented transition strategy that aligns with the Paris agreement. 


### ESG rating (vs. benchmark)



Benchmark: JP Morgan Government Bond Sweden - Total Return Index



### Risk & Reward Profile (RRP)

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 3 years. The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this Fund as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact the Fund's capacity to pay you. Be aware of currency risk. Concentration risk: To the extent that the fund invests a large portion of its assets in a limited number of industries, sectors, or issuers, or within a limited geographical area, it can be more risky than a fund that invests more broadly.

### Glossary / Definition of Terms

### Alpha

The risk-adjusted excess return relative to the benchmark, resulting from portfolio active management. It reflects the portion of the excess return that is not explained by systemic risk.

### **Average Coupon**

Defined as the average interest payment of portfolio's fixed income positions relative to their principal value.

### Average Rating

The average credit rating of all fixed income securities in the portfolio

A measurement of the volatility of returns relative to the overall market beta equal to one. A security with beta higher (lower) than one has greater (lower) risk relative to the broad market.

### Commitment

Represented by the sum of notional, or the sum of the commitments of individual derivatives after netting and hedging.

### Correlation

The degree to which two variables move together. The metric assumes values between -1 and 1. A positive (negative) correlation means that variables move in the same (opposite) direction(s). If there is no relationship between each other, the correlation will be close to zero.

### **Effective Duration**

The relative sensitivity to an absolute change in the interest rates. More specifically, it gives the percentage change in instrument value if all interest rates are increased by an absolute of 1%.

### Effective Yield

The weighted average of yields of the fund's investments, taking derivatives and dividend yield on equity securities into account. Each instrument's yield is calculated in its currency denomination. It is not a return expectation, but a snapshot of the rate of return of the fund's investments at current prices, yields and FX levels.

### Fund VaR

The probability-based estimate of the minimum loss over a period of time (horizon), given a certain confidence level, presented as percentage of the assets under management of the fund.

### Information ratio

A measure of risk-adjusted return that is defined as the excess annual return of the portfolio over its benchmark (active return) relative to the variability of that excess return (tracking error). It is used to assess the added value of the active management.

### Maximum Drawdown

The largest loss measured from peak to trough until a new peak is attained.

### **Modified Duration To Worst**

A measure of sensitivity of price to changes in the value of a bond in reponse to a change in interest rates, taking into account all call features.

### Ongoing charges

It is an estimate of the charges that excludes performance related fees and transaction costs including third party brokerage fees and bank charges on securities transactions.

### Running Yield

Annualised rate of return calculated as the annual income (coupons) of an investment divided by its current market value.

### **Spread Duration**

A measure of the sensitivity of the security price to changes in its credit spread. Credit spread is defined as the difference between the security yield and risk free benchmark yield.

### Tracking error

The volatility of the fund's excess returns over its benchmark returns. It quantifies how closely a manager's return pattern follows that of the benchmark.

### Volatility

A statistical measure of the distribution of returns for a specific time period with a certain confidence interval. It gives an insight on the amount of risk and uncertainty of a security or portfolio. Commonly, the higher the volitility, the riskier the security or portfolio.

### Year To First Call

The number of years until the next call date, in bond with embedded options.

### Year To Maturity

Amount of time, in years, until a bond reaches maturity and repays its principal.
