Objectives and investment policy

Objectives: The Fund aims to achieve a total investment return from income and capital appreciation, while seeking additionally to make a positive contribution to a positive climate change outcome in accordance with achieving the long term global warming objectives of the Paris Agreement.

Policy: The Fund mainly invests in fixed income securities (investments which provide a certain level of income or interest) issued primarily by companies around the world. The Fund aims to achieve its objective while managing credit risks through the careful selection and monitoring of fixed income securities together with broad diversification. The Fund seeks investments that have the potential to contribute positively to a positive climate change outcome in accordance with achieving the long term global warming objectives of the Paris Agreement and will not invest in companies or credit securities that do not meet these objectives. The Fund may invest in investment grade (seen as being higher quality) fixed income securities. However, the Fund may also invest in fixed income securities with low or no credit rating. The Fund's performance will reference the ICE Global Corporate Paris-Aligned Index (USD hedged). The Fund is actively managed meaning that the Investment Manager uses its expertise to select

investments rather than tracking the allocation of the performance of a benchmark.

The Fund will also invest in derivatives (instruments whose value is determined by changes in the value of the underlying assets they represent) to manage interest rate risk, currency risk, credit risk as well as to seek to improve the performance of the Fund.

You can buy and sell shares in the Fund on any dealing day. A dealing day is generally defined as a day on which Irish banks and, if applicable, the relevant stock exchange(s) are open for business. Exceptions are noted on the FSI website. As long as we receive your instruction before 10 am (Irish time) on a dealing day, shares will be bought and sold at that day's price.

The Fund will not pay any income out; instead any income will be reflected in the value of your shares.

Recommendation: This Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within five years.
