#### Objective


The Fund aims to achieve a combination of income and growth by investing in bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable interest rate) issued by companies, governments or other bodies, in Emerging Market countries.

The Fund aims to outperform the JP Morgan EMBI Global Diversified Index (USD) benchmark (before charges).

## Portfolio securities

- The Fund invests at least two-thirds of its assets in bonds issued by companies, governments or other bodies in Emerging Market countries.
- The Fund will invest up to 100% in Sub-Investment grade bonds.
- Bonds will be of any credit quality and typically in the currencies of the countries where they are issued.
