Objectives and Investment Policy

OBJECTIVE

To maximize the total return from income and capital growth by investment primarily (meaning at least three-quarters of the Fund's total assets) in a globally diversified portfolio of predominantly corporate and government fixed interest securities.

POLICY

The Fund will:

- invest anywhere in the world;
- invest in emerging markets;
- invest in a broad universe of bonds and similar debt investments (i. e. bonds issued by governments, companies and other public entities):
- invest in bonds which at the time of purchase may have a minimum credit rating of CCC-/Caa3 as rated by Standard & Poor's, Moody's, or other such recognised rating service, or if unrated, have been determined by the Investment Manager to be of an equivalent quality;
- invest on a long and short basis: and
- invest in derivatives (financial instruments whose value is derived from other assets) to help achieve the Fund's investment objective.
 The Fund will also use derivatives with the aim of risk or cost reduction or to generate additional capital or income.

The Fund may:

- invest up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in collective investment schemes;

- invest up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in Contingent Convertible Securities (CoCo's); and
- invest significantly in cash and cash-like investments.

Benchmark: The Fund will measure its performance against SOFR (30-day compounded) + 2% per annum (the "Cash Benchmark"). The Cash Benchmark is used as a target against which to measure its performance over 5 years before fees.

SOFR (the Secured Overnight Financing Rate) is a broad measure of the cost of borrowing cash overnight collateralised by U.S. Treasuries and is administered by the New York Federal Reserve.

The Fund is actively managed, which means the Investment Manager has discretion over the selection of investments, subject to the investment objective and policies disclosed in the Prospectus.

OTHER INFORMATION

Share Class Hedging: The Fund's base currency is USD whereas this share class currency is EUR. In order to reduce the risk of exchange rate movements between the share class currency and the base currency, a hedging strategy is used, although its outcome is not guaranteed.

Treatment of income: income from investments will be paid to shareholders quarterly on or before 11 February, 11 May, 11 August and 11 November.

Dealing: you can buy and sell your shares in the Fund between 9:00 and 17:00 (Irish time) on each business day in Ireland. Instructions received before 12:00 will receive the price quoted on that day. The minimum initial investment for this share class is EUR 5,000,000.

Risk and Reward Profile

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We have calculated the risk and reward category, as shown above, using a method of calculation derived from EU rules. It is based on the rate at which the value of the Fund has moved up and down in the past (i.e. volatility) and is not a guide to the future risk and reward category of the Fund. The category shown is not a target or guarantee and may shift over time. Even the lowest category 1 does not mean a risk-free investment.

This Fund is in category 3 because its historical value has shown moderately low volatility. With a Fund of category 3, you have a moderately low risk of losing money but your chance for gains is also moderately low.

- Objective/Performance Risk: There is no guarantee that the Fund will achieve its objectives.
- Currency Risk: This Fund invests in international markets which means it is exposed to changes in currency rates which could affect the value of the Fund.

- Derivatives Risk: Derivatives are highly sensitive to changes in the value of the asset from which their value is derived. A small movement in the value of the underlying asset can cause a large movement in the value of the derivative. This can increase the sizes of losses and gains, causing the value of your investment to fluctuate. When using derivatives, the Fund can lose significantly more than the amount it has invested in derivatives.
- Changes in Interest Rates & Inflation Risk: Investments in bonds/ money market securities are affected by interest rates and inflation trends which may negatively affect the value of the Fund.
- Credit Ratings and Unrated Securities Risk: Bonds with a low credit rating or unrated bonds have a greater risk of default. These investments may negatively affect the value of the Fund.
- Credit Risk: The issuer of a security held by the Fund may not pay income or repay capital to the Fund when due.
- Emerging Markets Risk: Emerging Markets have additional risks due to less-developed market practices.
- Share Class Hedging Risk: The hedging strategy is used to reduce the impact of exchange rate movements between the share class currency and the base currency. It may not completely achieve this due to factors such as interest rate differentials.
- CoCo's Risk: Contingent Convertible Securities (CoCo's) convert from debt to equity when the issuer's capital drops below a pre-defined level. This may result in the security converting into equities at a discounted share price, the value of the security being written down,

temporarily or permanently, and/or coupon payments ceasing or being deferred.

 Counterparty Risk: The insolvency of any institutions providing services such as custody of assets or acting as a counterparty to derivatives or other contractual arrangements, may expose the Fund to financial loss.

Charges

The charges cover the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and selling. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.


