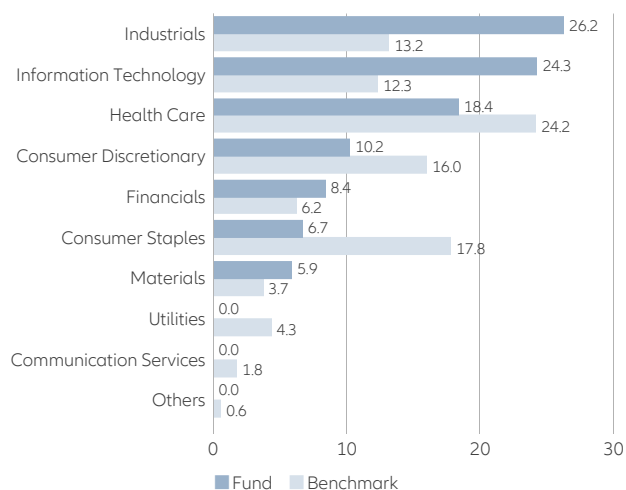

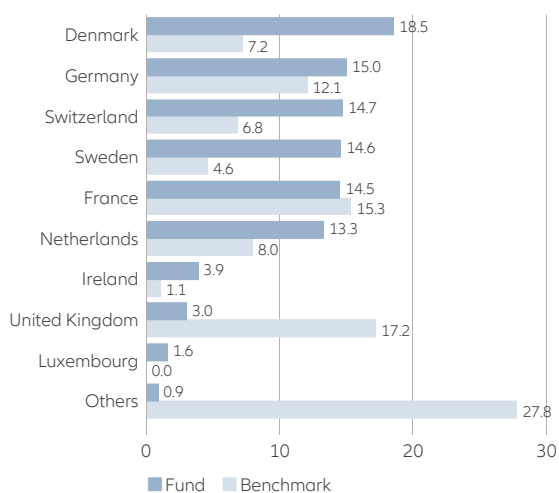
Sector Breakdown (%)
