Objective

The Fund aims to achieve a combination of income and growth by investing in bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable interest rate) issued by governments and government-related bodies around the world.

The Fund aims to outperform the Bloomberg Global Treasury Universal-GDP Weighted by Country Index (USD) benchmark (before charges).

Portfolio securities

- The Fund invests at least two-thirds of its assets in bonds issued by governments or governmentrelated bodies anywhere in the world.
- Bonds will typically have investment grade ratings. Up to 20% of the Fund may be invested in Sub-Investment Grade bonds.
- Up to 25% of the Fund may be invested in Mainland Chinese bonds listed or traded on Chinese Markets.
