Objectives and investment policy

This Bond Fund is actively managed aiming to outperform the return of a customized benchmark composed mainly of BofA Merrill Lynch Contingent Capital Index (CHF Hedged) and BofA Merrill Lynch Euro Financial Subordinated & Lower Tier-2 Index (CHF Hedged). The portfolio and the performance of the Fund can deviate from the benchmark. The Fund invests at least two-thirds of its assets in contingent capital instruments, other hybrid and subordinated debt securities of financial institutions such as banks and insurance companies, which include fixed rate bonds, zero-coupon, perpetual bonds, notes, and similar fixed interest or floating-rate securities, which have a minimum credit rating of CCC- (Standard & Poor's) or Caa3 (Moody's). Contingent capital bonds are instruments that can be converted into equity

securities or written down to a maximum of 100% of their value with the purpose of improving the issuing financial institution's solvency in the context of crisis management. Conversion occurs based on trigger events either in accordance with contractual terms or regulatory discretion. The Fund uses derivatives to reduce the impact of changes in currency exchange rates on the performance for this Share Class. The investor can buy or sell shares of the Fund on a daily basis, as further defined in the prospectus. This Share Class does not make distributions. The Fund shall bear the costs of standard brokerage and bank charges incurred by the Fund through securities transactions in relation to the portfolio. These charges are not included in the "Charges" section of this document.

The Fund's risk and reward profile shows the variations in value an investment in this Fund would have undergone over the past five years. The Fund's risk rating may change in the future. Please note, higher possible gains generally also mean higher possible losses. The lowest risk category does not mean that the fund is risk free.

Why is the Fund in the specific category?

Investments in debt are affected by changes in interest rates, the size of the market segment, the currency allocation, the economic sector and the credit quality of the debt. Debt funds with shorter maturities tend to be less affected by changes in interest rates and so are debt funds investing primarily in highly rated governments, municipalities, corporates and other issuers. The Fund's application of Swing Pricing also impacts its risk and reward profile.

Are there any other particular risks?

The Fund's risk and reward profile does not reflect the risk inherent in future circumstances that differ from what the Fund has experienced in the recent past. This includes the following events which are rare but can have a large impact.

- Credit risk: Issuers of assets held by the Fund may not pay income or repay capital when due.
- Counterparty risk: Bankruptcy or insolvency of the Fund's counterparties may lead to payment or delivery default.
- Liquidity risk: It can have adverse effects in a situation when the Fund needs to sell assets for which there is not enough demand or only at much lower prices.
- Mandatory conversion risk: In the case a trigger event occurs contingent capital is converted into equity or written down and thus may lose substantially in value (eg. up to a maximum of 100% or total loss of value).
- Systemic risk: In addition, the Fund being predominantly exposed to financial institutions, adverse circumstances affecting this sector may cause material losses.
- Operational risk: Deficient processes, technical failures or catastrophic events may cause losses.
- Political and Legal risks: Investments are exposed to changes of rules and standards applied by a specific country. This includes restrictions on currency convertibility, the imposing of taxes or controls on transactions, the limitations of property rights or other legal risks.

From January 2016, the ongoing charges figure is based on last year's expenses for the year ending January 2016. This figure may vary from year to year. It excludes performance fees and portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the Fund when buying or selling shares/units in another collective investment undertaking.
