OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The objective of the compartment (hereinafter, the "Fund") is to achieve a return and/or a capital gain over a period of 5 years by managing a portfolio composed primarily of fixed or variable income debt instruments, with no restrictions on geography, currency, sector or issuer quality and up to 60% of the net assets may be invested in shares of companies, irrespective of size, sector or country. The minimum average rating for debt securities will be BB-. No more than 15% of net assets may be invested in unrated securities.

The net assets of the Fund will be invested primarily in bonds or other debt instruments, including convertible bonds, equities or other securities providing access to corporate capital, in UCITS, particularly ETFs, in warrants and in options.

As from 01/10/2022, the Fund may also invest in commodities, through ETCs or UCITS.

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets in structured products that can be linked to derivatives. Underlying assets of structured products may include fixed- or variable-income debt securities, corporate shares, and equity or bond indices. The structured products and their underlying assets comply with Article 41 of the Law of 2010 and the Grand-Ducal Regulation of 8 February 2008.

Within the limits of the investment restrictions as described in the prospectus, the Fund may make use of futures or interest rate, equity or index options, as well as interest rate and/or credit derivatives, either for hedging or asset exposure purposes.

For each Share Class, the Fund is authorised to hedge exchange rate risk as part of its asset management approach.

The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark index, specifically 18% MSCI Europe Net Total Return EUR Index (M7EU Index) + 14% MSCI USA Net Total Return USD Index (M1US Index) + 6% MSCI Emerging Markets Net Total Return USD Index (M1EF Index) + 2% MSCI Japan Net Return JPY Index (M7JP Index) + 14% ICE BofA Euro Government Index (EG00 Index) + 14% ICE BofA Euro Corporate Index (ER00 Index) + 8% ICE BofA Euro High Yield Index (HE00 Index) + 4% Bloomberg EM USD Aggregate Total Return Index Value Hedged EUR (EMUSTREH Index) + 20% of a capitalised index calculated from the €STR (€STRON Index).

The Fund is actively managed, meaning that it may significantly differ from the benchmark index in terms of its composition and that there is no restriction regarding the extent to which the Fund's portfolio may deviate from the index. The investment scope is not limited to the benchmark index; the manager may purchase securities or invest in sectors which are not cited, for example in order to benefit from specific circumstances or to adapt to market conditions.

The investments underlying this Fund do not take into account the European Union's criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities.

The base currency for the Fund is the Euro.

The investor may purchase or sell units of the Fund on a daily basis (full banking days in Luxembourg).

All the Fund's income is reinvested.

Significant risk(s) for the Fund not taken into account in this indicator include the following:

Investment in other UCIs/UCITS: A Fund that invests in other undertakings for collective investment will not play an active role in the daily management of the undertaking for collective investment in which it invests. In addition, a Fund will not generally have the opportunity to assess the specific investments made by the underlying undertakings for collective investment before they occur. Consequently, a Fund's returns shall depend on the performance of the managers of the underlying funds and could be adversely affected by poor performance.

Risk linked to the use of derivatives: The Fund may use derivatives, i.e. financial instruments whose value depends on that of an underlying asset. However, even minor fluctuations in the price of the underlying asset may cause significant changes in the price of the corresponding derivative. The use of over-the-counter derivatives exposes the Fund to a risk that the counterparty will fully or partially fail to honour its contractual obligations. This may result in a financial loss for the Fund.

Currency risk: The Fund invests in overseas markets and could be affected by fluctuations in exchange rates, which may cause the value of your investment to decrease or increase.

Liquidity risk: This is the risk that an asset cannot be sold at the expected price or within the desired time frame, due to the structural or cyclical narrowness of the market. This risk thus materialises by a decrease in the sale price of the assets concerned and/or a delay in the adjustment or liquidation of the portfolio.

The charges and commissions are used to cover the Fund's operating costs, including marketing and distribution of shares. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

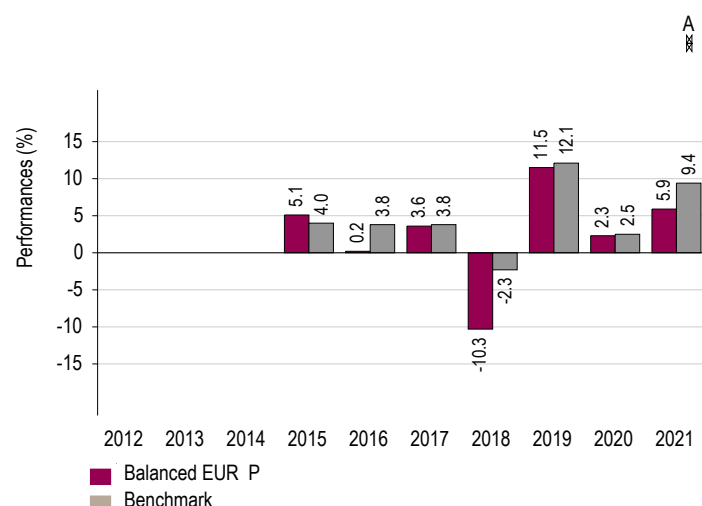
