
The Fund is managed by Vanguard Group (Ireland) Limited ("VGIL"), part of the Vanguard group of companies.

Objectives and investment policy

- The Fund seeks to provide returns consistent with the performance of the Barclays Global Aggregate Float Adjusted Bond Index (the "Index").
- The Index includes investment-grade and government bonds from around the world with maturities greater than one year.
- · The Fund attempts to:
 - 1. Track the Index by investing through physical acquisition, in a representative sample of the securities that make up the Index.
 - 2. The Fund may hold small amounts of cash and other securities except in extraordinary market, political or similar conditions where the Fund may temporarily depart from this investment policy.
- The Fund may invest in financial derivative instruments that could increase
 or reduce exposure to underlying assets and result in greater fluctuations
 of the Fund's net asset value. Some derivatives give rise to increased
 potential for loss where the Fund's counterparty defaults in meeting its
 payment obligations.
- The Fund invests in securities which are denominated in multiple currencies. Movements in currency exchange rates can affect the return of investments. Currency hedging techniques are used to minimise the risks associated with movements in currency exchange rates but these risks cannot be eliminated entirely.
- The Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.
- Income from the Fund will be reinvested and reflected in the price of shares in the Fund.
- Shares in the Fund can be sold on a daily basis (save on certain bank holidays or public holidays and subject to certain restrictions described in Appendix 1 of the Prospectus) by submitting an application in writing or by telephone before 12:00 (Irish time) on the relevant dealing day, or, where you hold shares with a platform, by submitting an application seeking the sale of your shares before the dealing cut-off time of the respective platform, provided this is before the dealing cut-off time for the Fund. - Emerging markets are generally more sensitive to economic and political conditions than developed markets. Other factors include greater 'Liquidity risk', restrictions on investment or transfer of assets and failed/ delayed delivery of securities or payments to the Fund.

- Index tracking risk. The Fund is not expected to track the performance of the Index at all times with perfect accuracy. The Fund is, however, expected to provide investment results that, before expenses, generally correspond to the price and yield performance of the Index.
- Index sampling risk. As the Fund uses an index sampling technique whereby a representative sample of securities are selected to represent the Index, there is the risk that the securities selected for the Fund may not, in the aggregate, approximate the full Index.
- Inflation risk. The value of your investments may not be worth as much in the future due to changes in purchasing power resulting from inflation.

Charges

The entry charge represents a preset dilution levy which covers the transaction costs of the Fund and protects the value of remaining shareholders interests. This charge is paid directly to the Fund and not to VGIL.
