### Objective and investment strategy

The Sub-Fund seeks both long-term growth of your investment, in EUR, from an actively managed listed equity, equity-related securities and derivatives portfolio, and a sustainable investment objective to advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by investing into companies whose business models and/or operational practices are aligned with targets defined by one or more SDGs and that create financial and societal value, and by applying an impact approach with a focus on Human capital management.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed with a Responsible Investment (RI) process in order to capture opportunities in European equity market, by mainly investing in equities of companies that are part of a benchmark index composed of 50% STOXX Europe Small 200 Total Return Net + 50% STOXX Europe Mid 200 Total Return Net ("the Benchmark") universe. As part of the investment process, the Investment Manager has broad discretion over the composition of the Sub-Fund's portfolio and can take, based on its investment convictions, large overweight or underweight positions on the countries, sectors or companies compared to the Benchmark's composition and/or take exposure to companies, countries or sectors not included in the Benchmark, even though the Benchmark constituents are generally representative of the Sub-Fund's portfolio. Thus, the deviation from the Benchmark is likely to be significant. The Sub-Fund bindingly commits to have at all times at least 70% of assets invested in companies which have been assessed internally through this impact assessment approach. The Sub-Fund invests essentially in equities of small and medium capitalisation companies domiciled or listed in the European geographical area. The Sub-Fund may invest:- not more than one third of its assets in money market instruments- up to 10% of its assets in convertible and straight bonds Within the limit of 200% of the Sub-Fund's net assets, the investment strategy may be achieved by direct investments and/or through derivatives. Derivatives may be used for efficient portfolio management purposes. The Sub-Fund aims to support on the long run the SDGs established by the United Nations with a focus on the social themes. It applies AXA IM's Impact approach <https://www.axa-im.com/who-we-are/impact-investing> according to which 5 key pillars are considered: intentionality, materiality, additionality, negative consideration and measurability. Firstly, the Sub-Fund bindingly applies at all times AXA IM's Sectorial Exclusion and ESG Standards Policies <https://www.axa-im.com/our-policies> and a "Best-in-class" (type of ESG selection consisting of giving priority to the issuers in the investable universe best rated from a non-financial viewpoint within their sector of activity, without favouring or excluding one sector relative to the stock market index or customized universe used as a basis for starting) selectivity approach consisting in selecting the best issuers in the investable universe based on a combination of AXA IM Sectorial Exclusions and ESG Standards policies and their ESG scores with a focus on the Human Capital score and using environmental, social and corporate governance (Responsible Investment) criteria with a focus on best human capital practices, as further described in the SFDR annex of the Sub-Fund. Secondly, the investment manager conducts a rigorous analysis of the companies' business model, management quality, growth prospects and risk/return profile. As an example, the ESG criteria may be carbon footprint for the environmental aspect, management of human resources and gender equality for the social aspect, or remuneration policy for the governance aspect. The ESG data used are based on methodologies relying in part on third party data and in some cases are internally developed, are subjective and may change over time. The lack of harmonised definitions can make ESG criteria heterogeneous. As such, the different strategies using ESG criteria and ESG reporting are difficult to compare with each other. Strategies incorporating ESG criteria and those incorporating sustainable development criteria may use data that appear similar but which should be distinguished because their calculation method may be different. AXA IM's ESG different methodologies described herein may evolve in the future to take into account any


improvements in data availability and reliability, or any developments of regulations or other external frameworks or initiatives - among others. The Sub-Fund is a financial product aiming to achieve a sustainable investment objective within the meaning of article 9 of the Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 of 27 November 2019 on sustainability-related disclosures in the financial sector.

## ESG-metrics definition

The fund integrates ESG criteria (environment, social, governance) into its management. Managers have ESG scores ranging from 0 to 10 for each of the ESG criteria for a large part of the investment universe. These ESG scores are based on raw data provided by external providers such as MSCI, Ethifinance, Gaia, but also AXA IM's fundamental and qualitative analysis teams.

E pillar: an analysis is made of environmental risks such as vulnerability to climate change, natural capital (risk of water shortage, solid programs to preserve biodiversity if important impact on fragile ecosystems, raw materials used to reduce environmental impact), toxic emissions, hazardous waste, environmental regulations, ...

S pillar: quality in the social pillar is assessed by considering personnel management, human capital development, financial protection of consumers, product safety and quality, community relations, access to health services, finance, ...

G pillar: the general organization of companies is analyzed through the structure of the board of directors, the directors' remuneration, business ethics, fiscal transparency...

The absolute ESG rating is based on a weighted average of the absolute ESG scores of the assets in the portfolio. If the fund has obtained 1 tree (5 trees), it means that it belongs to the lowest (highest) absolute ESG rating category.

The relative ESG rating is the difference between the absolute ESG score of the portfolio and that of the benchmark index. If the relative ESG rating is mentioned in green, this means that the absolute ESG score of the portfolio is at least 3% higher than that of the benchmark index. If the relative ESG rating is mentioned in yellow, this means that the absolute ESG score of the portfolio is between -3% and + 3% to that of the benchmark index. If the relative ESG rating is indicated in orange, this means that the absolute ESG score of the portfolio is at least -3% lower than that of the benchmark index.

The CO2 relative intensity corresponds to the difference between the Carbon footprint of the portfolio (expressed in tCO2 / million \$ of revenue) and that of the benchmark index. If the CO2 relative intensity is indicated in green, this means that the carbon footprint of the portfolio is at least 10% lower than that of the benchmark index. If the CO2 relative intensity is indicated in yellow, this means that the carbon footprint of the portfolio is between -10% and + 10% to that of the benchmark index. 


### Active Exposure by Sector (%)



### Glossary

Utilities : utility companies are organizations providing public services such as the production or distribution of electricity, the distribution and transmission of natural gas and water supplies.

Cons.disc. : includes automotive, durable consumer goods, media and distribution. These are sectors that are changing cyclically, in line with economic conditions.

Cons.stap. : includes companies selling basis goods and services (food, personal hygiene, household products, tobacco).

Small Caps : <5 bln €

Mid Caps : 5 bln € - 10 bln €

Large Caps : >10 bln €

Active share: Measures the difference between the portfolio's composition and the one of its benchmark index. It is based on the portfolio's weighting in relation to the index.

Active sector/regional exposure: Difference between the fund's weighting and its index, expressed as a percentage.

Volatility (%): is an indicative measure of degree of variation of an asset's price changes over time.

Relative Risk/Tracking Error (%): measures, in standard deviation, the fluctuation of returns of a portfolio relative to the fluctuation of returns of a reference index. The tracking error can be viewed as an indicator of how actively a fund is managed. The lower the number the closer the fund's historic performance has followed its benchmark.

Sharpe ratio: is the measure of the risk-adjusted excess return over risk free rate of a financial portfolio and is used to compare the excess return of an investment to its risk. The higher the Sharpe ratio the better the return compared to the risk taken.

Information Ratio (IR): is a measurement of portfolio returns above the returns of a benchmark to the volatility of those excess returns. The IR is used to compare excess return over a benchmark to excess risk over a benchmark. E.g : A manager who outperforms a benchmark by 2% p.a. will have a higher IR than a manager with the same outperformance who has taken more risk.
