Monthly commentary

The US Federal Reserve turned markedly more hawkish in January as it weighed up rising inflation and a milder-than-expected impact of the Omicron Covid-19 variant. This in turn sent both bonds and stocks lower with an accompanying rotation from growth into value. The Fund returned down on the month with gains from short bonds broadly offset by losses from long credit and equity positions.

Equity struggled against a bearish market backdrop. Here the worst pain was from longs in the Australian SPI 200 Index. These were switched to short at the end of the month. The Fund benefited from offsetting gains in short US pharma names and the FTSE China A50 Index as the position flipped from long to short as the month progressed. Losses were also incurred from long credit positions, most

notably in US 5y investment-grade and European high-yield indices.


Currency trading was mixed, finishing in the red. The US dollar rose in a broadly risk-off environment. This hurt long positions against the greenback such as UK sterling and the Canadian dollar as the position flipped from short to long as the month progressed. A long in the Brazilian real generated the biggest gain, while a short in the Korean won also fared well in sympathy with the country's stock market which hit a thirteen-month low.

A hawkish Fed took its toll on fixed income markets with benchmark US 10-year Treasuries rising around 30bp and yields generally rose at all maturities. This was beneficial for the Fund's short positioning across the curve, with top performers being long dated US treasuries and Gilts. The biggest detractors were long positions in Japanese 10-year bonds, and Canadian 10-year bonds which switched from long to short at the beginning of the month.



Performance chart 22 July 2009 to 31 January 2022*




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Distribution of Monthly Returns¹ 22 July 2009 to 31 January 2022


