OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The objective of the compartment (hereinafter, the "Fund") is to achieve a return and/or a long-term capital gain by managing a portfolio composed primarily of fixed or variable income debt instruments, with no restrictions on geography, currency, sector, maturity date or issuer quality. The minimum average rating for debt securities will be BB-. No more than 15% of net assets may be invested in unrated securities. The Fund may, in particular, invest up to 100% of its assets in securities denominated in offshore renminbi (CNH), i.e. issued outside mainland China.

Le The Fund may also invest directly in China, through Bond Connect, up to a maximum of 95% of the net assets. A description of the risks associated with this type of investment can be found in the prospectus.

The net assets of the Fund will be invested primarily in bonds or other debt securities, including convertible bonds. It may invest up to 10% of its net assets in UCITS, particularly ETFs. The Fund may also invest up to 20% of its net assets in CoCo bonds (contingent convertible bonds).

Within the limits of the investment restrictions as described in the Prospectus, the Fund may make use of futures or options contracts, as well as interest rate and/or credit derivatives, either for hedging or asset exposure purposes


For each Share Člass, the Fund is authorised to hedge exchange rate risk as part of its asset management approach.

Currently and until 30/09/2022, the Fund's objective is to outperform its benchmark, the Markit IBoxx ALBI China Offshore Investment Grade total Return Index (IBXXJA4N). As of 01/10/2022, the benchmark index will be as follows: 65% Bloomberg China Govt 1-10y (I33620CN) + 35% Markit Iboxx ALBI China Offshore Non-Govt Invest. Grade (IBXXCNNI). The Fund is actively managed, meaning that it may significantly differ from the benchmark index in terms of its composition and that there is no restriction regarding the extent to which the Fund's portfolio may deviate from the index. The investment scope is not limited to the benchmark index; the manager may purchase securities or invest in sectors which are not cited, for example in order to benefit from specific circumstances or to adapt to market conditions.

The investments underlying this Fund do not take into account the European Union's criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities. The base currency for the Fund is the US dollar, while the exposed currency is the offshore renminbi (CNH). The investor may purchase or sell units of the Fund on a daily basis (full banking days in Luxembourg and Hong Kong).

All the Fund's income is reinvested.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



This indicator represents the annual historical volatility of the Fund over a 5-year period. Risk category 3 reflects a limited potential gain and/or loss in the portfolio's value. This is due to investments in bonds and debt securities denominated in renminbi (CNH).

Significant risk(s) for the Fund not taken into account in this indicator include the following: Risks linked to emerging markets: The Fund invests in emerging markets, which carries a higher risk than investing in developed markets. Investments in emerging markets are likely to experience greater rises and falls in value and may suffer trading

problems. A Fund that invests in emerging markets rather than developed countries may encounter difficulties when buying and selling securities. Emerging markets are also more likely to experience political uncertainty and investments held in these countries may not have the same protection as those held in more developed countries.

Concentration risk: To the extent that the Fund's investments are concentrated in one particular country, market, industry or asset class, it could suffer losses due to adverse occurrences affecting that country, market, industry or asset class.

Risks associated with holding high-yield bonds: The Fund invests in sub-investment grade bonds. These bonds may produce a higher level of income than investment-grade bonds but at a higher risk to your capital.

Risk linked to holding contingent convertible bonds (CoCos): Contingent convertible bonds may be automatically converted into shares or be subject to a reduction in value, if the financial strength of the issuer declines in a specific way. This may lead to a substantial or total loss of the bond's value.

Risk linked to the use of derivatives: The Fund may use derivatives, i.e. financial instruments whose value depends on that of an underlying asset. However, even minor fluctuations in the price of the underlying asset may cause significant changes in the price of the corresponding derivative. The use of over-the-counter derivatives exposes the Fund to a risk that the counterparty will fully or partially fail to honour its contractual obligations. This may result in a financial loss for the Fund.

Liquidity risk: This is the risk that an asset cannot be sold at the expected price or within the desired time frame, due to the structural or cyclical narrowness of the market. This risk thus materialises by a decrease in the sale price of the assets concerned and/or a delay in the adjustment or liquidation of the portfolio

Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect and Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect: The Stack Connect (HKSC). This means that the Fund will be subject to the rules and regulations issued/amended by HKSC, in particular regarding the quota limit and the suspension of transactions. When using HKSC, the Fund will be subject to operational risk, settlement of compensation and custody risk.

The charges and commissions are used to cover the Fund's operating costs, including marketing and distribution of shares. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.


