Objectives and Investment Policy

Investment Objective:


The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of Euro denominated and Euro-hedged convertible bonds.

Investment Policy:

In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 75% of its assets in investment grade, non-investment grade and unrated convertible bonds (and other similar securities) issued by companies of any size that are based in or carry out most of their business in Europe. The Fund may invest up to 10% in investment grade bonds, non-investment grade bonds and unrated convertible bonds (and other similar securities) issued by non-European companies, including emerging market companies.

The Fund may invest up to 15% of its assets in contingent convertible securities. These are bonds that convert to equities if the issuer runs into difficulty. However, this exposure is not expected to exceed 10%. The Fund may invest up to 25% of its assets in non-convertible bonds (and other similar securities), and up to 10% in shares of companies.

Why is this Fund in this specific category?

This Fund is classified in category 4 because its price or simulated data has shown medium fluctuations historically.

Material risks not fully captured by the Risk and Reward Indicator:

- Convertible Bond Risk Convertible securities are structured as bonds that typically can, or must, be repaid with a predetermined quantity of equity shares, rather than cash. Therefore, they carry both the risks of equities, and the credit and default risks typical of bonds.
- Counterparty Risk The possibility that the counterparty to a transaction may be unwilling or unable to meet its obligations.

The Fund may also invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds, including HSBC funds.

The Fund may also invest in derivatives. The Fund may use them for hedging, cashflow management and investment purposes. Derivatives may also be embedded in other instruments used by the Fund.

- The Fund may enter into securities lending transactions for up to 29% of its assets. However, this is not expected to exceed 25%.
- The reference currency of the Fund is EUR. The reference currency of this share class is EUR.
- The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark.
- Income is reinvested.
- You may sell your investment on most working days.
- Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 3 years.

- Default Risk The issuers of certain bonds could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds.

Charges


The charges you pay are used to pay the running costs of the Fund, including the marketing and distribution costs. These charges reduce the potential growth of the investment.

The French FCP HSBC Europe Convertibles was similarly created on 16/12/2008 following the merger by absorption of the SICAV L Convertibles (the" Merging Fund 2 from inception until 16/12/2008.
