OBJECTIVE AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The Fund's investment objective is to provide capital appreciation over the long-term.

Under normal circumstances, the Fund will invest at least 80% of its net assets in Equity and ERS of Emerging Market Companies with any market capitalisation.

The Fund may focus its investments in a particular geographic region or industry sector. However, the Fund expects to maintain exposure to a minimum of five industry sectors at any one time. Investments may include securities listed on the Russian market (up to 30% of NAV) and China A Shares purchased using the StockConnect. The Fund may utilize currency forward contracts, currency futures, currency options and equity index futures for hedging purposes. On an ancillary basis the Fund may invest up to 10% of its NAV in other UCITS and exchange traded funds.

The Fund is actively managed and is not managed in reference to a benchmark index. However the Fund uses the MSCI Emerging Markets (Net) Index to compare performance.

For Accumulating classes, any income or gains of the Fund (net of expenses) will be accumulated and reinvested into the NAV of the Fund. For Distributing classes, any income less expenses earned will be distributed in accordance with the distribution policy in the prospectus.

Investors can buy or sell shares on any day on which banks are open for business in Dublin and London.

Recommendation: This Fund is not suitable for investors unable to maintain a long term investment.

Equities: securities representing an equity instrument in a company such as common stock.

ERS: equity related securities including, but not limited to, depositary receipts which provide investors equity exposure to a company in another jurisdiction through a securities market outside of the jurisdiction of the company's domicile and participatory notes which are an FDI (that does not embed leverage) designed to replicate equity exposure in markets where direct investment may be impossible or unduly difficult such as Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, South Korea and Taiwan.

Emerging Market Countries: every country except the U.S., Canada, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, and most of the countries in Western Europe.

Emerging Market Companies: a company: (i) which has at least 50% of its assets located in, (ii) which has at least 50% of its revenue generated in or risk of loss attributable to, (iii) is organized or maintains its principal place of business, principal operations or principal manufacturing facilities in; or (iv) the securities are traded principally in an Emerging Market Country.

FDIs: a derivative contract between two or more parties whose value depends on the rise and fall of the relative value/price of an underlying asset.

NAV: net asset value of the Fund.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The Fund is in category 6 as assets it holds have historically been subject to moderate to high levels of price fluctuation. This indicator above is based on partially simulated data and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The Fund is exposed to additional risks not captured by the risk indicator including, without limitation:

Emerging Markets Risk: emerging market securities are subject to greater social, political, regulatory, and currency risks than developed market securities. Certain countries, including China and Russia, may also have greater risks of lack of investor protection, criminal activity and unclear tax regulations. There is also a heightened risk that monies from the Fund's investments may be subject to government restrictions on payments outside of the issuers' country. These factors may impact the liquidity and value of such securities and, consequently, the value of the Fund.

Liquidity Risk: the Fund may have difficulty buying or selling certain securities readily, which may have a financial impact on the Fund.

Equities & ERS Risk: the values of Equities and securities based on them are subject to changes in the issuing (or related for ERS) company's financial condition and overall market and economic condition as well as market perception.

Investment Management Risk: the Fund's strategies and selected investments may not produce the intended result, and the Fund may not achieve its investment objective. Loss of one or more Investment Manager employees could impair the Fund's ability to realise its investment objectives.

Currency Risk: changes in exchange rates may reduce or increase the value of non-U.S. Dollar denominated assets held by the Fund.

Class Currency Risks (Representative Classes): (Hedged Classes) Currency hedging may not be successful in mitigating the effects of exchange rate fluctuations on non-USD classes. (Unhedged Classes) performance of unhedged classes may be affected by changes in exchange rates between the class currency and the US Dollar.

Credit/Counterparty Risk: a party with whom the Fund contracts for securities may fail to meet its obligations (e.g. fail to pay principal or interest or to settle an FDI) or become bankrupt, which may expose the Fund to a financial loss.

Volatility Risk: price movements in the Fund's investments are volatile and affected by a wide variety of factors, including changing supply and demand relationships, interest and exchange rate fluctuations, international events and government policies and actions with respect to economic, exchange control, trade, monetary, military and other issues.

FDI and Leverage Risk: in addition to Counterparty Risk, FDI may fluctuate in value rapidly and leverage embedded in FDI may cause losses that are greater than the original amount paid for the relevant FDI.

Operational Risk: human error, system and/or process failures, inadequate procedures or controls may cause losses to the Fund.

Performance Fee Risk: a performance fee may accrue even where shares of the Fund experience a decline in value and may be paid on unrealised gains that are never realised. Such fees may also create an incentive to undertake investments carrying greater risks.
