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

LO Funds - Euro BBB-BB Fundamental is a long only corporate bond fund launched in December 2010. The Fund is actively managed. The Bloomberg Barclays Euro-Aggregate Corporates 500MM is used for performance and internal risk indicators comparison. The Fund invests mainly in EUR denominated investment grade corporate bonds applying a best-in-class approach to Sustainable investing and maintains an Investment Grade (IG) average portfolio rating. It seeks to achieve higher risk-adjusted returns than traditional investment grade indices. The investment approach is two-fold: a disciplined analysis which differs from a traditional market-cap approach by allocating to sectors and companies based on fundamental criteria including extra financial data (i.e. ESG, carbon intensity and controversies); and a forward-looking credit analysis aiming to further mitigate the credit default risk and identify bottom-up opportunities taking into account financial and extra-financial information. Risk management is performed by fund managers at a portfolio level, alongside independent teams who oversee investment risks and operational risks.



Barclavs Euro-Aggregate: Corporates - 500MM EUR









PARTICULAR RISKS

GLOSSARY

Total Expense Ration (TER): The total fees involved in managing and operating a fund. The TER included the annual management fee and other charges, for example legal, admin, and audit costs (source: annual audited reports or semi annual non audited reports). **Risk and Reward Profile**: This indicator (SRRI) represents the annualized historical volatility of the Sub-Fund over a 5-year period. Where there are less than 5 years worth of data, missing returns are simulated using an appropriate benchmark. The SRRI may change over time and should not be used as an indicator of future risk or returns. Volatility: A statistical measure of the fluctuations of a security's price. It can also be used to describe fluctuations in a particular market. High volatility is an indication of higher risk. Correlation: Correlation is a measure of how securities or asset classes move in relation to each other. Highly correlated investments tend to move up and down together while investments with low correlation tend to perform in different ways in different market conditions, providing investors with diversification benefits. Correlation is measured between 1 (perfect correlation) and -1 (perfect opposite correlation). A correlation coefficient of 0 suggests there is no correlation.

Tracking Error: A measure of how closely an investment portfolio follows the index against which it is benchmarked.

Yield to Maturity: The rate of return anticipated on a bond if it is held until the maturity date.

Modified Duration: This formula is used to determine the effect that a 100-basis-point (1%) change in interest rates will have on the price of a bond.
