Proprietary valuation models are used to select stocks with good earnings prospects and a reasonable valuation.

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 4.41%.

Robeco New World Financials had a higher return than the benchmark in February. The best contributors to performance in February were Nu Holdings, Coinbase, Adyen, Block, Hana Financial, Standard Chartered, Intercontinental Exchange and KKR. The biggest detractors from performance were Endava, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Prudential, ASR Nederland and Julius Baer. The best-performing trend was Digital Finance, which made a strong positive contribution to performance. The Emerging Finance trend made a small positive contribution, while the Aging Finance trend contributed negatively.

Market development

In a month marked by bullish sentiment, global equity markets maintained their upward trajectory. The MSCI ACWI delivered a robust 4.3% return in USD, while the MSCI AC World Financials Index gained 3.7% in February. The 'fade the cuts' trade is very much alive and inflation is the key risk to watch. Indeed, there is no need for the Fed to rush cuts given US growth resilience, the labor market rebalancing slowly and signs of disinflation progress despite noisy January data. The ECB is expected to follow the Fed's timelines, although the European economy is in much more need of rate cuts. Equity markets floating up with interest rates drifting higher is a bit of a worry, but as long as the earnings outlooks remains supportive, we believe investors will look past the delay in rate cuts. For now, the market narrative is dominated by anything artificial intelligence-related, and it is therefore good to observe that an increasing number of financial stocks across a wide range of subsectors are making new all-time highs.

Expectation of fund manager

Equity markets thrived amid 2023's challenges, emphasizing the profitability of 'climbing a wall of worry'. For the year 2024, central bank policies and real interest rates will set market tones. Despite past consensus errors, the fund maintains a vigilant approach. Trends like Aging Finance, Emerging Finance and Digital Finance continue to drive growth, with opportunities in private assets, alternative credit and digital banking. The Aging Finance trend addresses global pension and healthcare gaps, while Emerging Finance targets the expanding middle class in emerging markets. Digital Finance showcases growth in digital wallets and profitable digital banks. With a balanced portfolio strategy, the fund expects continued growth in digital finance companies amid market volatility.

Regional allocation

Robeco New World Financials selects the long-term trends that are expected to show the most powerful growth over the long term. Within the trends, the fund managers select the companies that will best capitalize on long-term trend growth. How much we invest depends on the stock valuation, where we look for growth at a reasonable price. As we look top-down at trends and bottom-up at stock selection, regional or sector spreads are merely the result of the investment process, though we do monitor limits.

Currency allocation

The fund takes small active currency positions, but generally hedges back to the benchmark. We do not hedge currency exposures in emerging markets, as this is costly. This leads to a small USD balance.


The fund incorporates sustainability in the investment process through exclusions, ESG integration, engagement and voting. The fund does not invest in issuers that are in breach of international norms or where activities have been deemed detrimental to society following Robeco's exclusion policy. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up investment analysis to assess existing and potential ESG risks and opportunities. In the stock selection the fund limits exposure to elevated sustainability risks. In addition, where a stock issuer is flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to engagement. Lastly, the fund makes use of shareholder rights and applies proxy voting in accordance with Robeco's proxy voting policy.

The following sections display the ESG-metrics for this fund along with short descriptions. For more information please visit the sustainability-related disclosures. The index used for all sustainability visuals is based on MSCI All Country World Financials Index (Net Return, EUR).

Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The Portfolio Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating chart displays the portfolio's ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The Distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. Index scores are provided alongside the portfolio scores, highlighting the portfolio's ESG risk level compared to the index.

Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. For comparison, index footprints are shown besides that of the portfolio. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

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

SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. For comparison, index figures are provided alongside that of the portfolio. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.


Engagement

Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching internationals standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

The fund promotes E&S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation, integrates sustainability risks in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, proxy voting and engagement.

The fund is not constrained by a benchmark but the fund may use a benchmark for comparison purposes. The majority of stocks selected will be components of the Benchmark, but stocks outside the Benchmark may be selected too. The fund can deviate substantially from the weightings of the Benchmark. The fund can deviate substantially from the selector weightings of the Benchmark. There are no restrictions on the deviation from the Benchmark. The Benchmark is a broad market weighted index that is not consistent with the ESG characteristics promoted by the fund.

Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.01% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.
