

Key Investor Information

This document provides you with key investor information about this Fund. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature and the risks of investing in this Fund. You are advised to read it so you can make an informed decision about whether to invest.

Objectives and Investment Policy

The Fund's primary objective is to grow the amount invested over the long-term through investment in Equities and Debt Securities of issuers around the world. This may include securities of issuers in developing countries (which may constitute more than 20% of NAV). Investments in Russian securities are limited to 10% of NAV.

The Fund seeks to achieve its objective primarily through investing in Equities, typically comprising around 90% of NAV. The Fund may also invest in Debt Securities, typically not more than 10% of NAV. The amount of Debt Securities may be increased when market circumstances dictate.

The Investment Manager seeks to identify investments that will produce growth. Investment decisions are based on global economic developments, outlooks for securities markets, interest rates and inflation, supply and demand for Debt Securities and Equities and analysis of specific issuers.

Other than Debt Securities and Equities considered FDI pursuant to regulation, FDI are utilised for the purposes of hedging currency risk only.

Any income or gains of the Fund (net of expenses) will be accumulated and reinvested into the NAV of the Fund

Investors can buy or sell shares on any day on which banks in Dublin are open and the New York Stock Exchange is trading.

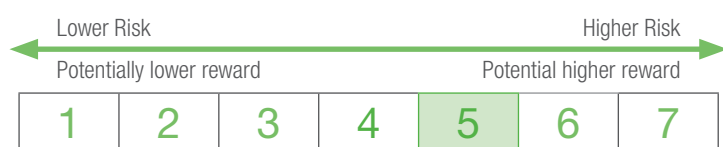
Debt Securities: may include but are not limited to various types of debt obligations including corporate issuers, government and government agencies, and bonds convertible at the option of the Fund into Equity. Such securities may be of any maturity, fixed or floating interest rate, and of any credit rating or unrated (with a maximum of 30% of NAV in below investment grade or unrated securities under any market circumstances).

Equities: any type of instrument providing an equity interest including common and preferred stocks, investment funds and exchange traded funds (limited to 10% of NAV), publicly traded real estate investment trusts, equity trusts, partnership interests instruments which provide exposure to a company in another jurisdiction through a securities market outside of that jurisdiction.

FDI: a derivative contract between two or more parties whose value depends on the rise and fall of the relative value/price of an underlying asset.

NAV: net asset value of the Fund.

Risk and Reward Profile



The Fund is in category 5 as assets it holds have historically been subject to high levels of price fluctuation. The category shown is not guaranteed and may change over time. It is based partially on historical data of a similar fund of the Investment Manager, and may not be a reliable indication of future circumstances. The lowest category does not mean a risk free investment.

The Fund is exposed to additional risks not captured by the risk indicator including, without limitation:

Equities Risk: the values of Equities are subject to changes in the issuing company's financial condition and overall market and economic condition as well as market perception.

Debt Securities Risk: changes in interest rates and credit quality may have adverse consequences to the Fund. Below investment grade securities are more sensitive to economic, regulatory and social developments and have greater Liquidity Risk.

Currency Risk: changes in exchange rates may reduce or increase the value of non-U.S. Dollar denominated assets held by the Fund. Currency hedging may not be successful in mitigating such effects.

Developing Countries Risk: developing country securities are subject to greater social, political, regulatory, and currency risks than developed market securities. Certain countries, such as Russia and China, may also have greater risks of lack of investor protection, criminal activity and unclear tax regulations. This may impact the liquidity and value of such securities and, consequently, the value of the Fund.

Credit/Counterparty Risk: a party with whom the Fund contracts for securities may fail to meet its obligations (e.g. fail to pay principal or interest or to settle an FDI) or become bankrupt, which may expose the Fund to a financial loss.

Liquidity Risk: the Fund may have difficulty buying or selling certain securities readily which may have a financial impact on the Fund.

FDI and Leverage Risk: in addition to Counterparty Risk, FDI may fluctuate in value rapidly and leverage embedded in FDI may cause losses that are greater than the original amount paid for the relevant FDI.

Class Currency Risks (Representative Classes): (Hedged Classes) Currency hedging may not be successful in mitigating the effects of exchange rate fluctuations on non-USD classes. (Unhedged Classes) Performance of unhedged classes may be affected by changes in exchange rates between the class currency and the US Dollar.

Operational Risk: human error, system and/or process failures, inadequate procedures or controls may cause losses to the Fund.
