Objectives and investment policy

The Fund's objective is to achieve long term income and capital The Fund will invest primarily in bonds issued or growth. guaranteed by companies that are exposed directly or indirectly to emerging market countries. The Fund may also (i) invest in bonds issued or guaranteed by governments in emerging market countries,(ii) invest up to 10% of its assets in bonds of companies and governments which are not in emerging market countries and (iii) invest in bonds that are convertible into shares. Emerging market countries shall consist of all those countries which are included in the JPMorgan CEMBI Broad Diversified Total Return Index at the time of the relevant investment.

Up to 10% of the Fund's assets may be invested in bonds of companies or governments which are experiencing financial or operational distress, default or may be in bankruptcy. These types of bonds are typically referred to as distressed bonds.

The Fund has the power to use derivative instruments for investment purposes. Derivatives allow the Investment Manager to track changes in the price of an item, for example a corporate bond or index, without actually owning it. Derivatives may be used to gain exposure to a number of different asset classes, including company shares, financial indices and currency exchange rates. The Fund may also use derivatives for hedging purposes. Investment in financial derivative instruments can introduce significant leverage risks and lead to high volatility.

Any income arising in relation to this share class will be distributed on a quarterly basis (i.e. no automatic reinvestment) by default.

Investors are able to buy and sell shares during any valuation day if you tell us to buy or sell shares no later than 5pm (Luxembourg time) on the business day preceding the valuation day.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. - The lowest category does not mean 'no risk'.
- The Fund is in this category due to the nature of its investments and previous levels of volatility (how much the value of the fund rises and falls).
- Market and exchange rate movements can cause the value of an investment to fall as well as rise, and you may get back less than originally invested.
- Bond values are sensitive to interest rate changes and downgrades by credit agencies. This Fund may invest in bonds which have a low / no credit rating including high yield and distressed bonds. While such bonds may offer a higher income, the interest paid on them and their capital value is at greater risk of not being repaid, particularly during periods of changing market conditions. The value of income payments will fluctuate.
- In difficult market conditions, reduced liquidity in bond markets may make it harder for the manager to sell assets at the quoted price. This could have a negative impact on the value of your investment. In extreme market conditions, certain assets may become hard to sell in a timely manner or at a fair price. This could affect the Fund's ability to meet investors' redemption requests upon demand.
- The Fund uses derivatives for investment purposes which under certain market conditions may cause the Fund to significantly fall in value. Investments in financial derivative instruments can introduce leverage risks which can amplify gains or losses in the Fund.
- Investment in emerging markets carries greater risk than investment in more traditional western markets. This may result in large falls in the Fund's value over short periods of time.
- There is a risk that any company providing services such as safe keeping of assets or acting as counterparty to derivatives may become insolvent, which may cause losses to the Fund.
- All the share class charges are taken from capital. Should there not be sufficient capital growth in the Fund this may cause capital erosion.
