

Fund Strategy

The fund manager believes the key to better absolute and risk-adjusted returns in emerging markets is combining top-down macroeconomic analysis and bottom-up country analysis to allocate risk across interest rates and foreign currencies. With an investment horizon of 9 to 18 months, the fund manager believes that while the macroeconomic base case changes slowly, market pricing changes more rapidly, providing opportunities to take advantage of shifting risk premia.

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SFDR (Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation)

The Fund complies with Article 8 with respect to the EU's Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation*. As such, the fund promotes, among other characteristics, environmental or social characteristics or a combination of those characteristics. In addition, the companies in which the fund invests follow good governance practices. *Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on sustainability - related disclosures in the financial services sector.

Exclusion Framework

The Fund embeds an exclusionary framework to specific activities based on UN Global Compact, severe governmental sanctions, revenue thresholds for certain activities linked to environmental and/or social criteria, as well as ensuring that companies follow good governance practices. The list of activities and their thresholds are listed below:

UN Global Compact	- Non-Compliant
Country sanctions	- Sanctioned investments are prohibited*
Controversial weapons	- 0% of revenue including companies involved in the manufacture of nuclear warheads or whole nuclear missiles outside of the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT)

Unconventional oil & gas	- >= 5% of revenue on each of the following: Artic oil & gas exploration; Oil sands extraction; Shale energy extraction;

*At Invesco we continuously monitor any applicable sanctions, including those imposed by the UN/US/EU and UK. These sanctions may preclude investments in the securities of various governments/regimes/entities and as such will be included in our compliance guidelines and workflows (designed to ensure compliance with such sanctions). The wording of international sanctions is something that we pay particular attention to as there are occasions where sanctions can exist in limited form, for example allowing investments in the secondary market. In addition to sanctions targeting entire countries, there are other thematic regimes, which may focus for example on human rights, cyber attacks, terrorist financing and corruption, which may apply to both individuals and/or entities/corporations.

At Invesco we have looked to put in place minimum safeguards across multiple sub-funds of Invesco Funds (as listed above) to allow them to meet Article 8 requirements of the SFDR Regulation as of 2 November 2021. To be classified as a so-called Article 8 product, the sub-funds need to promote, among other things, environmental and/or social characteristics while also ensuring that investee companies follow good governance practices. In order to meet such requirements, it was determined that we would look to exclude certain activities based on certain thresholds, which may be updated from time to time. As noted above this is a proprietary framework developed by Invesco in line with Article 8 requirements of the Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on sustainability. The framework is developed, maintained and monitored by Invesco. In order to assess companies against the noted criteria, Invesco uses a combination of Sustainalytics and ISS (Institutional Shareholder Services) to assess compliance, however, this can be supplemented with other service providers where appropriate. While there is a broad coverage across the various systems, there is no one system that has complete coverage of the entire investment universe. As a result, investment teams will be responsible for conducting an assessment of companies for which data is not available, under the appropriate supervision and oversight of our investment compliance and ESG teams.
