The fund is managed by Nordea Investment Funds S.A., a company of the Nordea Group.

Objectives and investment policy

The fund's objective is to provide shareholders with investment growth in the medium to long term, while achieving above-market performance.

In actively managing the fund's portfolio, the management team selects securities that appear to offer superior investment opportunities.

The fund mainly invests in European high yield bonds and credit default swaps.

Specifically, the fund invests at least two thirds of total assets in high yield debt securities, contingent convertible bonds, and credit default swaps, that are denominated in EUR or GBP or are issued by companies (or their parent company) that are domiciled, or conduct the majority of their business, in Europe.

The fund may invest in, or be exposed to up to 20% of its total assets in asset-backed securities.

The fund's major part of currency exposure is hedged to the base currency, although it may also be exposed (through investments or cash) to other currencies.

The fund may use derivatives for hedging (reducing risks), efficient portfolio management and to seek investment gains. A derivative is a financial instrument which derives its value from the value of an underlying asset. The use of derivatives is not cost or risk-free.

The fund is subject to Nordea Asset Management's responsible investment policy.

Any investor may redeem its shares in the fund on demand, on a daily basis. This fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 5 years.

While the fund compares its performance against the ICE BofAML European Currency High Yield Constrained Index - Total Return 100% Hedged to EUR, it may freely select the securities that it will invest in. This share class is not distributing dividends. Income from investments

The fund is denominated in EUR. Investments in this share class settle as well in EUR.

The indicator measures the risk of price fluctuations in the fund certificates based on the last 5 years volatility and places the fund in category 3. This means that the purchase of units in the fund is

connected to **medium risk** of such fluctuations. Please note that category 1 does not mean a risk free investment.

Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the UCITS, as the category might change in the future.

Following risks are materially relevant to the UCITS but are not adequately captured by the synthetic indicator and may cause additional loss:

- Credit risk: A bond or money market security, whether from a public or private issuer, could lose value if the issuer's financial health deteriorates.
- Prepayment and extension risk: Any unexpected behaviour in interest rates could hurt the performance of callable debt securities (securities whose issuers have the right to pay off the security's principal before the maturity date).
- Derivatives risk: Small movements in the value of an underlying asset can create large changes in the value of a derivative, making derivatives highly volatile in general, and exposing the fund to potential losses significantly greater than the cost of the derivative.
- ABS/MBS risk: Mortgage-backed and asset-backed securities (MBSs and ABSs) typically carry prepayment and extension risk and can carry above-average liquidity risk.
- Hedging risk: Any attempts to reduce or eliminate certain risks may not work as intended, and to the extent that they do work, they will generally eliminate potentials for gain along with risks of loss.
- Convertible securities risk: Because convertible securities are structured as bonds that typically can, or must, be repaid with a predetermined quantity of equity shares, rather than cash, they carry both equity risk and the credit and default risks typical of bonds.
