


Objective


The Fund aims to achieve long term growth by investing in companies in Asia Pacific (excluding Japan) countries which in our view will make a positive contribution to society through their alignment achieving the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals ('SDGs').

The Fund aims to outperform the MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan Index (USD) benchmark before charges.

- The Fund invests at least 90% in equities and equity-related securities of companies based, or carrying out much of their business, in Asia Pacific countries (excluding Japan).
- The Fund may invest up to 30% of its net assets in Mainland China equities and equity related securities, although only up to 20% of its net assets may be invested directly through QFI regime, the Shanghai-Hong Kong and Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect programme.

 All equity and equity related securities will follow the abrdn Asian SDG Equity Investment Approach (the
- "Investment Approach"), which is published at www.abrdn.com under "Fund Centre"
- Financial derivative instruments, money-market instruments and cash may not adhere to this approach.
- The Fund will invest in companies with minimum of 20% of their revenue, profit, capital or operating expenditure or research and development linked to the UN's SDGs. For companies classified in the benchmark as "Financials", alternative measures of materiality are used based on loans and customer base. The Fund will also invest up to 20% in SDG leaders. These are companies that are considered to be integral to the supply chain for progressing
- towards the UN's SDGs, but may not currently meet the 20% materiality requirement. In addition, we apply a set of company exclusion which are related to normative screening (UN Global Compact, ILO, OECD), Norges Bank Investment Management (NBIM), State Owned Enterprises (SOE), Weapons, Tobacco, Gambling, Alcohol, Thermal Coal, Oil & Gas, Electricity Generation.
- The Investment Approach reduces the Fund's investment universe by a minimum of 20%

Key risks

- (c) The fund invests in emerging market equities and / or bonds. Investing in emerging markets involves a greater risk of loss than investing in more developed markets due to, among other factors, greater political, tax, economic, foreign exchange, liquidity and regulatory risks.

 The fund may invest in companies with Variable
- Interest Entity (VIE) structures in order to gain exposure to industries with foreign ownership restrictions. There is a risk that investments in these structures may be adversely affected by changes in the legal and regulatory framework.

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Management process

- The Fund is actively managed.
- The Investment Approach identifies companies which are aligned to the UN's SDGs. These goals are designed to address the world's major long-term challenges. These include climate change, growing social inequality, and unsustainable production and consumption.
- Through the application of this approach, the Fund has an expected minimum of 75% in Sustainable Investments. It also targets a lower carbon intensity than the benchmark.
- Engagement with external company management teams is used to evaluate the ownership structures, governance and management quality of those companies in order to inform portfolio construction.

 The benchmark is also used as a reference point for portfolio construction and as a basis for setting risk
- constraints and does not incorporate any sustainable criteria.
- In order to achieve its objective, the Fund will take positions whose weightings diverge from the benchmark and may invest in securities which are not included in the benchmark. The investments of the Fund may deviate significantly from the components of and their respective weightings in the benchmark.
- Due to the active and sustainable nature of the management process, the Fund's performance profile may deviate significantly from that of the benchmark.
