Objective

The Fund aims to achieve a combination of income and growth by investing in bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable interest rate) issued by governments, government related bodies and/or corporations in Mainland China, priced in Onshore Renminbi (CNY).

The Fund aims to outperform the FTSE Chinese Government Bond Index (CNH) benchmark (before charges).

Portfolio securities

- The Fund invests at least two-thirds of its assets in bonds issued by governments, government related bodies and/or corporations in Mainland China, priced in Onshore Renminbi (CNY).
- The Fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in Mainland Chinese bonds listed or traded on Chinese Markets.
- The Fund may also invest in bonds priced in Offshore Renminbi (CNH) which are issued by governments, government-related bodies or corporations around the world, as well as bonds priced in other currencies which are issued by the Chinese government, government-related bodies or corporations based, or carrying out the majority of their business activities in mainland China.
- The Fund will not purchase securities that are rated below B- by Standard & Poor's ('S&P') or equivalent from another rating agency.


Management process
