Objectives and investment policy

The objective of this Sub-fund is to outperform its benchmark index over a full market cycle by investing primarily on an opportunistic basis in an actively managed portfolio. Environmental, social and governance (ESG) criteria are one of the management components. However, the individual weighting of each of these criteria in the final decision is not defined upstream. **Benchmark index**

The performance of the Sub-fund may be compared with the MSCI Europe ex UK Index, expressed in EUR, calculated with net dividends reinvested.

The Sub-fund is actively managed. The benchmark index is exclusively used for performance comparison purposes.

The Sub-fund invests primarily between 75% and 110% of its net assets in equities of companies having their registered office in or listed on stock exchanges of a Member State of the European Union (EU) or a Member State of the European Economic Area (EEA).

The Sub-fund will make its investments based on fundamental research aimed at achieving a concentrated portfolio of equities. The Sub-fund may also invest up to 25% of its net assets in equity markets outside the EU/EEA (other OECD countries).

The Sub-fund is eligible for the French share savings scheme (PÉA).

The Sub-fund will consider all stock market capitalisations in all economic sectors, without limitation, and may invest in stocks denominated in currencies other than the euro.

The Sub-fund may be exposed to currency risk up to 100% of its net assets.

For cash management purposes, the Sub-fund may invest up to 25% of its net assets in transferable debt securities and money market instruments. The Sub-fund will primarily target issues from public or private issuers.

In order to protect its assets and/or achieve its management objective, the Sub-fund may use derivative financial instruments traded on regulated markets or over-the-counter markets.

At least 90% of portfolio companies will have an ESG rating. This will consist of either an internal ESG rating as defined by the Manager's responsible investment and ESG integration policy (available on its website at the following link: https://www.zadigfunds.com/about/esg-sustainability/), or a rating provided by an external non-financial rating agency.

In addition, the securities selection process includes negative screening designed to exclude companies that contribute to the production of controversial weapons, in accordance with

international conventions in this area, as well as companies exposed to activities related to thermal coal or tobacco, in accordance with the Edmond de Rothschild Group's exclusion policy, which is available on its website https://www.edmond-de-rothschild.com/fr/asset-management/investissement-responsable.


The Sub-fund is classified as "Article 8(1) of the Sustainability Regulation" because it promotes a set of ESG characteristics, although no benchmark index has been designated to achieve

these environmental or social characteristics

In line with its ESG strategy, the Sub-fund promotes environmental characteristics but does not invest in environmentally sustainable economic activities within the meaning of the Taxonomy Regulation. The investments underlying this financial product do not take into account the EU criteria for environmentally sustainable economic activities under the Taxonomy Regulation. Recommended minimum holding period: 5 years

Frequency of share purchases of sales: Investors may redeem their shares on every banking business day in Luxembourg except for Good Friday and 24 December (Christmas Eve) before 12:30 p.m. (Luxembourg time) on the applicable Valuation Day. Allocation of income: Accumulation

Risk and reward profile



The indicator shown above is calculated based on historical data and, as such, may not be a reliable indicator of the Sub-fund's future risk profile. Due to insufficient historical data, the risk indicator incorporates simulated data based on a reference portfolio. Risk category 6 reflects a potential for very high gains and/or losses in the value of the portfolio. This is primarily because of investments in equities on the European market.

Significant risks not taken into account in this indicator:

Concentration risk: To the extent that the Sub-fund concentrates its investments in a country, market, industry or asset class, it might incur a capital loss following adverse events specifically affecting this country, market, industry or asset class.

Currency risk: The Sub-fund invests in foreign markets and may be exposed to fluctuations in exchange rates, which may increase or decrease the value of its investments.

Liquidity risk: A liquidity risk exists when specific investments are difficult to sell or buy. This could reduce the Fund's returns if it is unable to enter into transactions under favourable conditions

Risk associated with derivatives: The Sub-fund may make use of derivatives, i.e. financial instruments whose value depends on that of an underlying asset. Fluctuations in price of the underlying asset – even slight fluctuations – may result in significant changes in the price of the corresponding derivative. The use of over-the-counter derivatives exposes the Sub-fund to the risk of that the counterparty fails to honour, either partially or totally, its commitment to pay. This could lead to the Sub-fund incurring a financial loss

Impact of hedging techniques: The use of derivatives for hedging purposes in a bull market could reduce the earning potential.

Credit risk: When a significant level of investment is made in debt securities, the Sub-fund may be exposed to the risk that a borrower may not repay all or part of their loan on time.

Counterparty risk: The Sub-fund may incur losses if a counterparty defaults and is unable to meet its contractual obligations.

Operational risk: The Sub-fund may incur losses due to the failure of operational processes, particularly those relating to the custody of assets. The occurrence of any of these risks may negatively impact the net asset value.

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The performance fee is set at 20% of the difference between the NAV of the Class and the target NAV (Starting Target NAV adjusted by the performance of the benchmark index). A performance fee may be paid even in the event of negative performance. Payable annually on 31 December.

The charges and fees you pay are used to cover the costs of running the Sub-fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing the units. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

The entry and exit costs shown here are maximum amounts; in some cases, investors may pay less.


Investors can find out the actual entry and exit costs from their adviser or distributor.

The percentage of ongoing charges is based on charges for the 12 months preceding the month of December 2023. This percentage may vary from year to year. It excludes performance fees and intermediary fees except for entry and exit charges paid by the Fund when buying or selling units of other Funds.

The performance fee paid during the last financial year ended in March 2023 represents 1.25% of average net assets.
