



Investment Policy

This sector-based equity fund invests along the value chain of the global infrastructure opportunity set. The investment universe encompasses companies that provide the facilities and services necessary to maintain and develop modern infrastructure, and also includes companies supplying infrastructure-related products and services. The objective is to maximize total return from capital appreciation and dividends over extended periods of time. Potential Risks


