# GLOBAL EQUITY SUSTAINABLE HEALTHCARE

## Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a concentrated portfolio of shares of companies that may benefit from increasingly constrained healthcare budgets worldwide, while promoting ESG characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.



# Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed.

In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 70% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of Healthcare Companies of any size, that are based in in developed and emerging markets. Healthcare Companies have current and/or expected revenue exposure to sustainable healthcare products; they are determined by HSBC proprietary analysis process including sustainable healthcare scores.

The Fund will not invest in shares of companies which have material exposure, exceeding a revenue exposure threshold, to specific excluded activities, including: companies involved genetic manipulation of the germline of humans; the production of controversial weapons and tobacco; companies with more than 10% revenue generated from thermal coal extraction or from coal-fired power generation.

The Fund can invest up to 40% in China A and China B-shares, up to 10% in other funds, and may invest in bank deposits, money market instruments and funds for treasury purposes. See the Prospectus for a full description of the investment objectives and derivative usage.



# Main risks



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

#### Sector allocation (%)



# Monthly performance commentary

At sector level, stock selection was positive for the month. Positive performance came from Health Care and Consumer Staples.

At country level, stock selection was positive for the month. Positive performance came from USA and Switzerland, though this was offset by negative stock selection in the UK and Denmark.

USA Health Care security, ESTABLISHMENT LABS HOLDINGS with total effect 0.74% was the top contributor. Additionally, USA Health Care security, ARCUTIS BIOTHERAPEUTICS INC was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.26%. USA Health Care security, SAREPTA THERAPEUTICS INC also contributed with total effect 0.26%.

On the other side, detractors included USA Health Care security ICON PLC with total effect -0.29%, USA Health Care holding, ROIVANT SCIENCES LTD with total effect -0.29%, and USA Health Care holding, INSULET CORP with total effect -0.26%.

During this period, we opened positions in SUPERNUS PHARMACEUTICALS INC, APELLIS PHARMACEUTICALS INC, UNIPHAR PLC. On the other hand we closed positions in ICON PLC, KARUNA THERAPEUTICS INC, AXONICS INC, ADDUS HOMECARE CORP.

Sector and Country allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At a country level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Japan. At sector level, effects were positive, given an overweight exposure to Consumer Staples.
