Objectives and Investment Policy

The objective of the Fund is to generate returns in excess of the Russell 2000 Total Return Index.

The Investment Manager will actively manage the Fund through a bottom-up selection to generate returns through both long and short positions.

Under normal market conditions, the Fund is expected to hold long positions up to 130% of its net assets and indirect short positions up to 30% of its net assets but may vary from these targets depending on market conditions.

The Fund aims to achieve its investment objective by investing in a portfolio consisting of long and synthetic short positions in liquid equity, equity-related instruments and bonds.

The core portfolio of the Fund is expected to be constructed of North American equity securities, exchange-traded and OTC equity options, exchange-traded equity futures and other financial derivative instruments such as CFD and funded and/or unfunded TRS.

The Fund may also take an indirect exposure to the above listed instruments by investing through UCITS, UCIs or ETFs.

The Fund may also, during the ordinary course of its investment policy, hold up to 49% of its net assets in in liquidities such as, among others, bank deposits, money market UCIs (within the 10% limit in UCITS and/or

other UCIs) and Money Market Instruments. The Fund may hold up to 20% of its net assets in Ancillary Liquid Assets.

The Fund may also invest up to 10% of the Fund's net assets into "Rule 144A" securities, which in accordance with US Law are not registered with the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC).

Investments in SPACs are allowed up to 10% of the Fund's net assets.

The Fund may hold, on a temporary basis and for defensive purposes, up to 100% of its net assets in liquidities such as cash deposits and Money Market Instruments.

The Fund may use financial instruments and derivatives for hedging purposes, for efficient portfolio management purposes and for investment purposes.

The Fund is open-ended. You may redeem shares of the Fund on any Luxembourg business day.

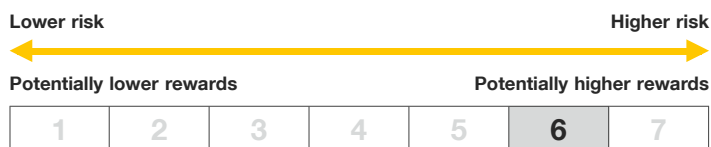
The Share Class makes a dividend payment.

The Benchmark of the Fund is the Russell 2000 Total Return Index.

Other Information

The Fund is categorized as one that, in the Management Company's and the Investment Manager's view, promotes environmental or social characteristics pursuant to article 8 of SFDR. To be clear, it does not have a "sustainable investment" objective as defined by SFDR.

Risk and Reward Profile



This indicator represents the annual historical volatility of the Fund over a 5-year period. Its aim is to help investors understand the uncertainties attached to gains and losses that may have an impact on their investment.

The Fund's diversified exposure to short term debt instruments explains its classification in this category.

Significant risk(s) for the Fund not taken into account in this indicator include the following:

Derivative Risk: The Fund uses derivative instruments to achieve higher performance through speculation on rising or falling prices. Increased opportunities may lead to increased risk of losses.

Counterparty Risk: The Fund primarily concludes derivatives trades with various contracting parties. There is a risk that counterparties may no longer be able to honour their payment or settlement obligations.

Emerging Markets Risk: Investment in any emerging market carries a higher risk than investment in a developed market; emerging markets may afford a lower level of financial, legal, social, political and economic

structures, protection and stability as well as uncertain tax positions which may lead to lower liquidity and to the risk of losses.

Liquidity Risk: Risk related to a limited market activity that could not allow the Fund to sell or buy underlying investments in suitable conditions.

Credit Risk: The Fund invests a substantial portion of its assets in bonds. The issuers may become insolvent, whereby the bonds may lose a major part of their value or their value entirely.

Currency Risk: Investments in currencies other than the base currency of the Fund may be subject to foreign exchange risk. The Fund may attempt to hedge or reduce foreign exchange risk, generally through the use of derivatives. However, it may not be possible or practical to hedge or reduce such risk at all times.

Operational Risk and Depositary Risk: The Fund may fall victim to fraud or other criminal acts. It may also incur losses due to misunderstandings or errors by employees of the management company, the depositary or external third parties. Finally, its' management or the custody of its' assets can be adversely affected by external events such as fires, natural disasters etc.

Sustainable Finance: Currently, there is not universally accepted framework or list of factors to consider to ensure that investments are sustainable. Legal and regulatory framework governing sustainable finance is still under development. The lack of common standards may result in different approaches to set and achieve ESG (environmental, social, and governance) objectives. Applying ESG criteria to the investment process may exclude securities of certain issuers for non-financial reasons and, therefore, may forgo some market opportunities available to funds that do not use ESG or sustainability criteria.

Performance fee: Positive or negative Performance Adjustment of the Variable Management Fee up to +/- 1.875% from the VMF Midpoint of 2.175% with a VMF Minimum 0.30% and VMF Maximum of 4.05%. The performance adjustment depends on whether, and to what extent, the Fund's performance exceeds, or is exceeded by, the VMF Midpoint Hurdle (i.e., the Benchmark plus 6.25%) during the Performance Period.

The entry and exit charges shown are maximum rates. In certain cases, the charges paid may be lower.

The indicated ongoing charges are an estimate based on the expected total amount of charges as this share class has not yet been launched. This percentage may vary from year to year. It excludes performance fees, if applicable, and portfolio trade-related costs, with the exception of costs paid to the custodian and any entry/exit charge paid to an underlying collective investment scheme. The Fund's annual report for each financial year will include detail on the exact charges made.

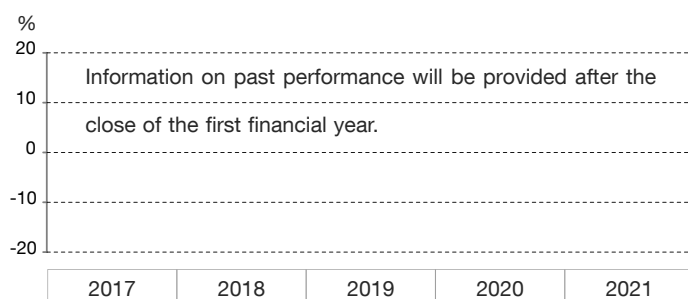
A conversion commission of up to 5.00% maximum of the net asset value per share class to be converted may be charged.
