



# Swisscanto (LU) Equity Fund Selection Technology B

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## **Quarter report**

### 1. Market review

In the third quarter, the credit crisis that had started in the US housing market finally developed into an international financial crisis with repercussions on the global economy. The interest rates for government bonds are falling, the risk mark-ups for corporate bonds are reaching new peaks, banks are hardly prepared to grant loans any more and profit expectations must be lowered. The closed credit market and the high level of debt in the financial sector are forcing a rigorous reduction of positions, accordingly leading to falling market prices in all risk-prone asset classes. In this connection, the technology sector reacted more violently to market uncertainties, which once again affected semiconductor stocks in particular, but also alternative technology securities, especially those in the solar sector. The software and hardware sectors developed best, because these companies normally conclude rather long-term agreements with customers and thus react to new market conditions later in the cycle and with less volatility. Among the winners were SAP and Alliance Data Systems. The lists of losers is long; one should mention Research in Motion (profit warning at the end of September), Nortel, Mastercard and MEMC Electronics, which is active in the solar sector. In Japan, Nintendo and Toshiba suffered in particular.

#### 2. Performance review

In the third quarter, the fund lagged somewhat behind the benchmark. July and turbulent September were particularly difficult. In August, when the relatively stable figures for the second quarter were presented, the market calmed down and a part of the underperformance was made good. The underweight in the semiconductor sector paid off; on the other hand, the positions in solar technology and the underweight in Hitachi had a negative effect.

#### 3. Outlook

Although technology companies have had a relatively robust course of business up to now, the turbulence in the financial sector and the increasingly weak economic situation have had a negative influence on technology investors as well. The majority of companies have, it is true, so far confirmed their outlook for the whole year, but some have nonetheless become slightly more cautious. The figures for the second quarter thus helped the sector to calm down. We are assuming that the uncertainties in the market will be allayed in the medium term, but are expecting that the growth forecasts in the technology sector will diminish slightly in the coming year on account of worldwide economic trends. We regard many technology securities, above all in the software sector, as attractively valued. In principle, we favour companies with an outstanding range of products and a strong market position.
