Fund objectives and investment policy

The fund aims to provide capital growth above Eurozone inflation (as measured by the Eurozone Harmonized Consumer Price Index) after fees have been deducted over rolling three to five year periods by investing in a broad range of asset classes worldwide. There is no guarantee that the objective will be attained and your capital is at risk. The fund is actively managed and may invest worldwide in commodities, equities, bonds and other alternative asset classes in any currency, either directly or indirectly through open-ended investment funds and ETFs. The fund may invest indirectly in commodities and other alternative asset classes through derivatives, investment funds or structured securities. The fund may invest in excess of 50% of its assets in bonds that have a below investment grade credit rating (as measured by Standard & Poor's or any equivalent grade of other credit rating agencies). The fund may exceptionally hold up to 100% of its assets in cash. The fund may use derivatives with the aim of achieving investment gains, reducing risk or managing the fund more efficiently.


